



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the Twentieth fourth Day of March Anno Dom. 1735 The Above Described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Samuel Moorhead in Erie Township in Lancaster County Beginning at a White Oak Thence South 82 Degrees West by Jacob Kissell's Settlement 55 perches to a White Oak Thence North 60 Degrees West by the same 62 perches to a Birch Thence South West by Thomas Shanklyn 133 perches to a Hickory Thence West by the same 27 perches to a post Thence South 10 Degrees West by the same 60 perches to a post Thence South 80 Degrees East by the same 14 perches to a post Thence South 10 Degrees West by the said Shanklyn 106 perches to a post on the line of Philip Evans Thence South 65 Deg. East along the same 10 perches to a Black Oak Thence North 63 Degrees East by Archibald McCurdy 94 perches to a White Oak Thence North 14 Degrees East by the same 10 perches to a post Thence North 76 Degrees West 7 perches to a White Oak Thence North 14 Deg. East by the said McCurdy 92 perches to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred & Sixty Four Acres Beside the allowance of six Per Cent.
