



Obt. Virtue of a Warrant from the Honourable the Proprietories dated the 27th day of January 1737 Anno Dom. 1737. Surveyed on the 7th day of April Anno Dom. 1738. to Andrew Lepor. a Tract of Land situate in the Township of Paxton in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak. Thence North ²⁰ degrees West 240 perches to a post; thence South 70 degrees East 106 perches to a gum; Thence South 20 degrees East 240 perches to a White Oak; Thence North 70 degrees East 106 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and fifty Acres and the allowance of six acres per cent for Roads & Highways.
