



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 11th Day of March Anno Domini 1734. The above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto John Stinson in the Township of Dadesbury in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Black Oak in a line of the Cooper Mine Land. Thence North 85 degrees East by Joseph Stinson 220 perches to a Hickory. Thence North 30 degrees East by Daniel May 102 perches to a yew. Thence North 85 degrees West by William Porter 22 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 85 Deg. West by Vincent Lund 62 perches to a yew. Thence South by Daniel Pattersons Line 2 perches to a Dead Hickory. Thence West by South by some 190 perches to a Black Oak. Thence South by the line of the said Mine Land 65 perches to the place of Beginning Containing One hundred and twelve acres beside the allowance of six perches.
