A Draught of a Tract of land situate in Bern Towne in the County of Lancaster surveyed to Nicholas Kinzer on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November 1739 in pursuance of a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Proprietaries dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of May 1738 containing 100<sup>ac</sup> & allowance of 6<sup>ac</sup> for Roads &c but the<sup>sd</sup> Nich<sup>o</sup> Kinzer not complying w<sup>th</sup> the Conditions of s<sup>d</sup> Warr<sup>t</sup> the same with the said survey became void wherefore in pursuance of another Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Proprietaries dated ye 20<sup>th</sup> of June 1740 A Return of the said survey was made into ye secretar<sup>y</sup>s office on ye 21<sup>st</sup> of June 1740 in order to be confirmed by Patent to John Albracht Certified P. Benjamin Eastburn Survey Gen<sup>l</sup>
