



The above is a Draught of a Tract of Land situate on the Road leading from Redstone Ferry to the Town of Washington in Washington County called Springtown. Containing 393 Acres 3 Roods 23 Perches, surveyed February 23rd 1785 in Pursuance of a Certificate from the Commissioners of Virginia for a Settlement Right as followeth to wit

We the Commissioners for Adjusting Claims to Unpatented Lands in the Countys Monongahela, Yohogania & Ohio do hereby Certify that William Hill is Intitled to four hundred Acres of Land in the County of Monongahela on Pigeon Creek & Ten mile Creek To include his Actual Settlement made in the year one Thousand seven hundred and ^{Seventy three} also a right in preemption to one Thousand Acres adjoining thereto

Given under our hands at Coxes Fort the Eighteenth day of Feb^r 1780 the fourth year of the Common Wealth
