



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the Eighteenth day of April 1734. Surveyed to Solomon Cole a Tract of Land Situate in Oley in the County of Philada. Beginning at a white oak a corner of Mordecai Lincoln's land thence by the same North Seventy degrees west Sixty four perches to a white oak thence by land of Owen Richards North twenty degrees East fifty seven perches to a white oak thence by the said Owen's land South seventy degrees east Sixty two perches to a post thence by land of Peter Helton South Sixty four degrees East one hundred & ninety two perches to a post thence by land of John Alprick South Twenty degrees west one hundred & Twenty nine perches to a post thence by land of Joseph Kirkbride North Sixty Seven degrees west one hundred & Eighty nine perches to a white oak in Mordecai Lincoln's line thence by the same North ²⁰ East Eighty three perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and Seventy acres with the usual allowance of Six pcent. Surveyed April 20th 1734
