



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fifteenth day of April 1734 Surveyed unto George Cowkill a Tract of Land Situate in Old Cowisshoppin in the County of Philada. Beginning at a Dogwood Tree standing on the East side of Perkiomac Creek thence by land of Jacob Frock North East one hundred Seventy two perches to a post thence North West by lands of Peter Keeter thirteen perches & by land of Lewis Scheffer the same Course Eighty five perches to a post thence by said Scheffer North fifteen Degrees East fifty nine perches to a post thence by land of William Smith North Seventy five Degrees west ninety Eight perches to a post thence by land of William Wits South West Seventy two perches to a Alder Tree standing on the Banks of said Creek thence down the several Courses of the same to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred & fifteen acres with the usual allowance of Six pCent.
