



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Bartell Cooker a Tract of Land situate in New Cowissihoppin in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a post in a line of George & Marches land thence by land of Adam Skling South West one hundred and sixty perches and by Vacant Land the same Course Ninety Two perches to a Hickery thence by <sup>Vact. land</sup> North West one hundred and fifty four perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North East one hundred and fifty two perches to a post thence by Vacant land South East fifty perches to a post thence by Vacant land and land of Daniel de Bar North East one hundred perches to a post thence by <sup>the</sup> land of Jacob Shelhammer & George March South East one hundred and four perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred acres with the usual Allowance of six Percent Surveyed 9<sup>br</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> 1734 by Nich<sup>o</sup>. Scull
