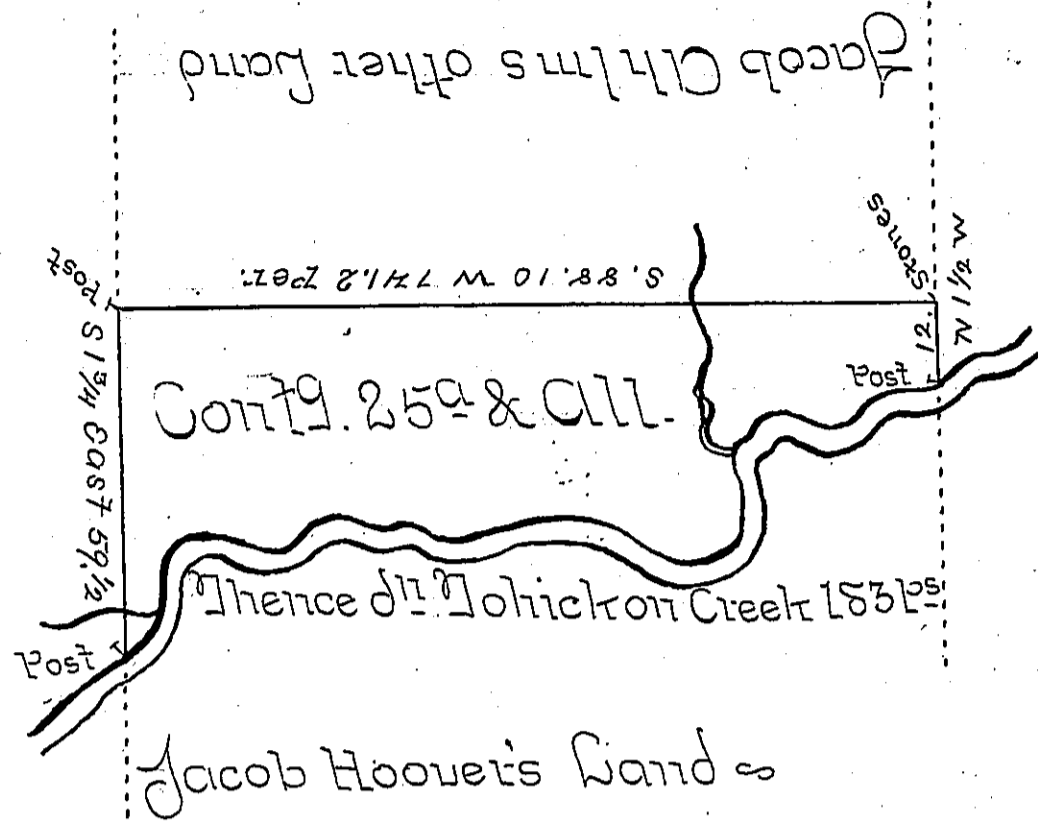

The Land of which the above is a Description aboundeth with  
 Stones, which are immovable; but a small Part of it can be call'd  
 Plowable - there may be made about 2<sup>a</sup> of middling good Meadow  
 the Timber, if standing lower in the <sup>Country</sup> is thought might be valu-  
 able The greatest Account of it to Jacob Ahlm is its joining  
 his other Land <sup>Country</sup> and Tohickon Creek thereby supplying  
 him w<sup>th</sup> Water which his other Land cant afford to do. but in  
 particular Season's of ye Year.
