



A Draught of a Tract of Land called the long Bottom situate on the South side of the West Branch of Susquehanna River beginning a few Perobl. above the mouth of a small Creek which empties ^{into} the opposite side of the River known by the name of the Ten Mile Creek being the first Creek on that side of the River above Chingleclamouche Old Town and about six Miles above it about obl Miles ^{above} Minor Kissler's Land & one Mile and an half below Nicholas Weaver's Land in the County of Bedford Containing three hundred and thirty three Acres and the usual Allowance of six Percent for Roads &c surveyed the 2^d day of July 1773 for Nicholas Conner in Pursuance of a Warrant granted to him the twelfth day of May in the same year to John Suters Esq^r Surveyor } by Thomas Smith U.S. General of Pennsylvania &c.
