



The above described tract of land of two hundred and twelve acres and one hundred and seventeen perches and allowance of six per cent for roads, is part of a larger tract of three hundred and thirty acres and allowance, Situate in Huntington Township Luzerne County which was surveyed the 22^d day of October Anno Domini 1772 to Gustavus Adolphus Whitefoot, in pursuance of his warrant dated the 7th day of September Anno Dom. 1772. Resurveyed and divided off the 9th Day of September Anno Domini, 1802. The residue of the said larger tract is situate within the line of ^{one of the seventeen} Huntington Townships and for which Compensation has been had.
