



In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16th day of June 1872, a survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of July following, on a certain lot of ground in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland, marked in a General Plan of said Town Number Two hundred and twenty-two, containing in Breadth East and West on Hurtleberry Street sixty feet and in Length North and South Two hundred and thirty feet. Bounded Northwardly by Raspberry Alley, Eastward by Lot No 221, Southward by Hurtleberry Street, and Westward by Lot number Two hundred and twenty three.

Returned into the Secretary's Office the 29th day of July 1874 for Martin Abrey by Warrant dated the 28th July 1874
