



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries Dated March 14<sup>th</sup> 1733 Surveyed to Joseph Brown a Certain tract of Land Situate in Plumsted Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Black Oak in the line of William Britains land thence by Vacant land North East two hundred and forty one perches to a post thence by Vacant land South East one hundred and seventy six perches to a post thence by Vacant land South West one hundred and twenty one perches and by other land of S<sup>r</sup> Jos. Brown the same course one hundred and twenty perches to a stone a corner of S<sup>r</sup> Britains land thence by the same North West one hundred and seventy six perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred & fifty acres with the usual allowance of six p Cent
