 an acre) resurveyed in June 1789 and the dotted Triangle  
 53<sup>as</sup> 129<sup>ps</sup> left out by Consent when sold to David Scott by  
 Richard Neave and Richard Neave the younger, now con-  
 taining four hundred and fifty six acres and one hundred  
 and forty Perches and the usual allowance for Roads &c
