



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>able</sup> Proprietaries granted unto Henry Dowland bearing Date the second Day of March Anno Dom 1737

I have Survey'd and Laid - unto Henry Dowland on a branch of Yellow breeches Creek in Lancaster County on the west side Susquehanna river Two hundred ~~and thirty~~ <sup>thirty two</sup> acres of Land with allowance of six p Cent Beginning at a black oak thence South five Degrees Westerly one hundred and Twenty perches to a Hickory Then North Eighty five Degrees Westerly Three hundred and twenty eight perches to a hickory North five Degrees Easterly one hundred and twenty perches to a White oak Thence South Thirty five Degrees Easterly Three hundred and Twenty Eight perches to the place of Beginning Survey'd April 14<sup>th</sup> 1738 p me
