



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing Date the fourteenth Day of February A. Dom. 1737, I have Surveyed and Laid out unto William Bayley in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the West side of Susquehanna River. One hundred <sup>20</sup> acres of Land with allowance of 6 p. Cent. Beginning at a maple Tree by Yellow breeches Creek Thence South fifty Degrees Westerly Two hundred perches to a Mickery Thence North forty Degrees Westerly one hundred and twenty four perches to a Black Oak Thence by the branch Thirty five perches to an Ash Thence North Thirty seven Degrees Easterly forty perches to a White Oak Thence North fifty Degrees Easterly Eighty three pches to a Black Oak by the said Creek Thence Down the same Traversing the severall Courses thereof near about Two hundred and Thirty perches to the place of Beginning Surveyed April 14<sup>th</sup> 1738 To Benja Eastburn Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> p me: Zach<sup>y</sup> Dutcher Spt
