



In pursuance of a Warrant granted to the heirs & Representatives of William Veneables dec'd dated the 27th day of February 1752. for a City lot appurtenant to the purchase of 416 $\frac{2}{3}$ ^a. I did survey & lay out on the 5th day of May 1767 a certain lot or piece of ground, situate on the West side of Fifth Street, between Walnut and Spruce streets, containing in Breadth on 5th Street Eighty two feet four inches, and in length Westward one hundred and Ninety Eight feet. Bounded Eastward by Fifth Street afo^s Northward & Westward by Vacant Ground, & Southward by a lot formerly laid out to George Leaves. And on the 20th day of October 1773. I divided the same lot into two Equal parts the Northernmost Moiety or 41 feet 2 inches there of is now in the possession of Jacob Van Reed of the City of Philadelphia, and the Southernmost Moiety or forty one feet two inches thereof is now in the possession of William Ashbridge Returned into the Secretaries Office the 6th day of November 1773. -
