



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 20th Day December Anno Dom. 1736^{for 150^e} surveyed unto Sebastian Jaglin a Certain Tract of Land situate on a Branch of Cocolico Creek in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak marked for a Corner Thence extending North 50 Deg^s West 42 P^s to a post South 70 Deg^s West 11 1/2 P^s to a White Oak South 29 Deg^s West 20 P^s to a Gum Tree = South 57 Deg^s East 98 P^s to a white oak North 21 Deg^s East 19 P^s to a Black Oak North 20 P^s to a white oak and North 38 Deg^s East 70 P^s to the Place of Beginning Containing 57 Acres & the usual Allowance for Roads &c Survey'd the 11th Day of July A^d 1737
