



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietarys Dated the first day of November Anno Dom 1735 There is survey d. unto Joseph Bennett Three hundred acres of Land with allowance of six p Cent in Lancaster County on the west side of Susquehanna River and Begins at a Black-oak near a branch of Conewaga Creek Thence south forty Degrees Westerly Two hundred and eighty pches to a White Oak Thence north fifty Degrees Westerly One hundred and eighty two pches to a White oak Thence north forty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and eighty pches to a white oak Thence South fifty Degrees Easterly One hundred and Eighty two pches to the place of beginning.
