



By Virtue of a Warrt. from the Honorable, Proprietaries bearing date the twenty seventh day of ~~February~~^{March} 1738 I have survey'd and laid out unto John Hanno in the Township of Hope-well in the County of Lancaster one the west side ~~the~~ Susquehanna River one hundred and Sixty three acres of Land with allowance of Six p. Cent.

Beginning at a black oak thence north sixty nine degrees westerly two hundred and thirty four perches and an half to a Hickery thence south twenty one degrees westerly one hundred and ~~sixty seven~~^{sixty} perches to a white oak thence south sixty nine degrees easterly one hundred perches to a Hickery thence north ~~fifteen~~^{fifty one} degrees easterly one hundred and fifteen perches to a Black oak, thence south sixty nine degrees easterly seventy seven perches to a Black oak, thence north twenty one degrees easterly sixty seven perches ^{& a half} to the place of Beginning
