



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the eleventh day of June 1734 Surveyed unto Michael Miller a tract of Land situate in Mapestown in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a post in the line of John Holder's land thence by the same South eighty degrees west ninety three perches and by Vacant Land the same course seventy seven perches to a hickery thence by Vacant Land North Ten degrees West two hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North Eighty degrees east one hundred and seventy perches to a Black Oak thence by Vacant Land South 61 or degrees East two hundred perches to ye place of Beginning Containing two hundred acres with the usual allowance of Six p<sup>er</sup> cent.
