



A Draught of 101 a. 70 perches of land with allowance of 6 percent for Roads &c situate in Granville Township Mifflin County on the Southside of the Juniata River Surveyed April 19th. 1853 in pursuance of a warrant to Geo. M. Culloch dated March 6th. 1851, chains carrier sworn Geo. W. Patton & Richard Eisenweiss, Assessor Thomas M. Clure Present Geo. M. Culloch. The dotted line within the survey shows the interference with a survey made by D. Hough late U.S. Sept. 9th. 1848 for Geo. Bumbough for which he obtained a warrant dated Nov. 11th. 1848 - In the common pleas of Mifflin County Aug. term 1850 Geo. Bumbough brings a suit against Geo. M. Culloch for a part of the above described survey - The case was tried at an adjourned court in March 1853 and on the 2nd day of April 1853 the Jury gave a verdict for Geo. M. Culloch the defendant. This cuts off 10.157 perches of Geo. Bumboughs 116 a. At this time a house on the tract used as a boarding house by men working on the Rail-Road.
