



Situate in Union Township Huntingdon County  
 Containing two hundred and Seventy three acres and one hun-  
 dred and fifty six perch and the usual allowance, for  
 roads &c first. Surveyed the 31<sup>st</sup>. day of August 1842. In pur-  
 suance of a warrant granted to Gabriel Bell, dated 5<sup>th</sup>.  
 day of March A. D. 1794 and resurveyed the 22<sup>d</sup>. day of Nov-  
 ember A. D. 1867. In pursuance of an Order of resurvey  
 granted to William Smith dated 19<sup>th</sup>. July A. D. 1861
