Beg. obliterated oak in the line of ^{North} Littlemoore track thence along said oak 622 p^{ts} to his Corner Black oak thence along one other of his lines north 061 81 p^{ts} to a Spanish oak in the said line thence along ^{John} Simpson 061 south 73 East 93 p^{ts} to a post thence South 64 East 120 p^{ts} to Sa. S. obl. Corner Hickory thence South 41 West 7 p^{ts} to a Corner in ^{white oak in} John Meens line 061 along said line south 70 West 101 p^{ts} to a Corner white oak thence South 061 9 p^{ts} to a post in John Meens line thence North 62 West 69 p^{ts} to a Hickory 061 North 85 West 76 p^{ts} to the place of beginning, Containing ^{94 1/2} 20 1/2 acres obl. the usual allowance of 0 1/2 p.
