



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries, Dated the Twenty-first day of February 1733, there was surveyed to Christopher Bezzell a Tract of Land Situate ^{next} to Oley in the County of Berks. Beginning at a post a Corner of James Thomson's Land, thence by Land of Mordca Lincoln North twenty degrees East seventy two perches & by Vacant Land the same Course twenty five perches to a White Oak Sapling thence by Vacant Land North West two hundred & fifty six perches to a Black Oak thence by Vacant Land South West one hundred & fifty one perches to a post in the line of Peter Roberson's Land thence by the same South East sixty perches to a post a Corner of Thomas Palmer's Land thence by the same South sixty degrees East twenty perches & the same course by Land of James Thomson one hundred and fifty four perches to the place of Beginning. Containing two hundred acres with the usual allowance of six to Cent.
