



Surveyed this Tract of Land By virtue of an Order from James Steel to me directed bearing date the 30 of the 6 month 1736 to William Blackfan Beginning at a marked black oak standing in Jeffrey Burgess line then north by the said land fifty ^{five} ~~four~~ perches to a black oak being the corner of the said Jeffreys land then East by the same eighty ^{seven} ~~four~~ perches to a small Ash, then north forty six perches by Thomas Ross land to a post by a marked hickory then north west one hundred and ninety seven perches by Vacant Land to a white oak marked upon the mountain, then south west one hundred and thirty three perches by Vacant Land to an Ash in a small Run then South East two hundred and four perches to the place of beginning by William other Land containing one hundred and fifty six acres and one hundred and fifty two perches of land lying in the manor of high Lands, in Bucks County, Surveyed on the 17 day of the 6 month 1736.
