



Situated on the waters of the North fork of Little Conemaugh, on both sides of the State Road leading from Frankston to the Mouth of Stony Creek, including the Dollar Camp and the 13 Mile tree in Conemaugh Township Cambria County, and surveyed the \_\_\_\_\_ day of June, 1794 by George Woods, jun<sup>r</sup>, Deputy Surveyor. In pursuance of two Warrants, one to William Smith, D.D. for 100<sup>9</sup>. dated the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1792 the other to Rebecca Blodget for 300<sup>9</sup>. dated the 21<sup>st</sup>. day of December, 1792.

Examined the 22<sup>d</sup> day of June, 1808.
