



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 22 day of August, Anno Dom. 1738. The above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed Unto John Crawford in the Township of Hanover & County of Lancaster. Begining at a white Oak at a Corner of John Reynold's Land Thence South by the same 110 perches to a white oak Thence East by the Settlement of James Crawford 240 perches to a post Thence North 29 Degrees East 66 perches to a white oak Thence North 5 Degrees East by Samuel Brown & Michael Harper 40 perches to a white oak Thence by the said Harper North 15 Degrees West 110 perches to a Post Thence South 70 Degrees West by James Finney 70 perches to a white oak Thence North 30 Degrees West by the same 30 perches to a Spanish Oak thence South 60 Degrees West by the sd. Finney & Robert Harvy 192 perches to the place of Begining, containing Two hundred & sixty four acres beside All of 6 & Cent. 7th of 9^{br}, 1739. ————— & Sam. Lightfoot. —
