



A Draught of a tract of Land called: Kingston, Situate on the south side of the North East branch of Susquehanna River above & adjoining the Honorable the Proprietaries, Manor of Stoke on a Brook called formerly Beaver Brook (now known by the name of Mill Creek) in Northumberland formerly Northampton County, Containing Two hundred & Sixty Seven acres besides the usual allowance of six & Cent. for Roads &c. Surveyed the 31<sup>st</sup> Day of May, 1771 for Cornelius Slack. In pursuance of an order dated the 3<sup>d</sup> Day of Aprile, 1769, N<sup>o</sup> 191.
