



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing Date the Eighteenth Day of March Anno Dom. 1737. I have Surveyed and Laid out unto David Magaw in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna river Two hundred & ninety three acres of Land with allowance of six & Cent. Beginning at a white oak Thence South Sixty degrees Easterly Two hundred and three perches to a post Thence South Thirty Degrees westerly two hundred and seventy one perches to a post in Robert (ob)ncletons Line Thence north Sixty Degrees westerly one hundred perches to a post Thence north fifteen Degrees Westerly one hundred and forty five perches to a post Thence North Thirty Degrees Easterly one hundred & sixty Eight perches to the place of Beginning. Survey'd Decem<sup>r</sup>: 30<sup>th</sup>: / 1741. To William Parsons Survey<sup>r</sup>: Gen<sup>l</sup>: & me Zach. Butcher. Dpt.
