



Surveyed Sept. 16th & 18th, 1840 the above represented tract of land in pursuance of a warrant to John Morehead & William Parsons for 800 acres of unimproved land dated July 8, 1839, situated in Shippen township, M^cKean County, adjoining lands of Brewster Freeman on the North and the Driftwood Branch of the Sinnemahoning Creek; on the East by Potter & M^cKean County Line; on the South by the heirs of W^m E. Wright, and on the west by the heirs of Cooper, Beginning on County Line at a Hemlock Corner, running West 240 perches to - run bearing S10°E. thence West 108 perches to Pine corner on old line, thence North 400 Perches to Beech Corner thence East 40 Perches to Post, thence S.63.E. 146 perches to post, thence N.28.E. 8 Perches to Hemlock on Bank of Sinnemahoning-thence down said Creek S.64 E.79 P.-S.50 E. 8 P.-S.61 E.14 P.-S.43 1/2 E. 14 P.-S.36 1/2 E. 12 P.-S.50 E.20 P.-S.65 E.8 P.-S.84 E.12 P.-S.36 E.8 P.-S.2 E.10 P.-S.47 1/2 E.30 P.-to County line, thence South on County line 228 perches to place of beginning, Containing seven hundred and sixty three acres & allowance of for roads &c. approved this day by me.
