



Situated on the waters of Dunnings Creek. Called the Rich Land (formerly Cumberland) now Bedford County, Containing 457 & a half acres with the allowance of six per Cent. for Roads &c. Surveyed by Richard Tea May 20th., 1785 (sic) Resurveyed September 18th, 1797 on Warrant granted to Thomas Fitzsimons Dated June 3d, 1763.
