



A Draught of a Tract of Land Surveyed the 23^d day of March 1801 for Roger Dougherty, in pursuance of an Order of the Board of property of Pennsylvania of the Seventh of February 1801 wherein it was ordered that the Claims of Roger Dougherty & the claim of Samuel Black should be represented in a General Diagram by the proper Deputy Surveyor, the Contending parties have affected a Compromise & settled the dispute, the above Containing one hundred and forty Acres one hundred and twenty nine perches with Six p^t Cent allowance, is the Land claimed by R Dougherty clear of any Interfering claim whatsoever, for which he has a warrant for 200 Acres, Dated 14th April 1788, Situate in Chartiers Township Washington County on the Waters of Chartiers Creek Called End of Strife-
