



By Vertue of Two Warrants (One for 100<sup>a</sup> dated the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1737. The other for 150<sup>a</sup> Dated the 17<sup>th</sup> Day May 1738.) There was Surveyed on on the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of Decem 1764 unto James Quick, the above discribed Tract of Land situate in Mount Bethel Township formerly in the County of Bucks, now in the County of Northampton, Containing Three hundred & Twenty three acres & 128 perches of Land & Allowance of Six Acres 7p Cent for Roads &c<sup>a</sup> }  
 To John Lukens Esq<sup>r</sup>. }

Warr<sup>t</sup> dated 13<sup>th</sup> June 1751 Vacating the above two Warr<sup>ts</sup> & ordering them to be returned for Edward Robeson.
