



Pursuant to a Warrant Under the hand of Thomas Penn Esq^r Proprietary of Pennsylvania and the lesser Seal & bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of March Anno Domini 1741. And by the Direction of the Surveyor General I have Surveyed and Laid Out for Henry Stirke a Tract of Land in the Township of Coventry in Chester County Beginning at a Corner black Oak Sapling. Near the line of William Ridge, Land thence North 73 Degrees East 194 Perches to a black Oak thence North 17 Degrees West 70 Perches to a black Oak thence North Seventy three Degrees East 120 Perches to a Post & heap of Stones thence North 17 Degrees West 44 Perches to a Post thence South 85 Degrees East 10 Perches to a Chestnut Oak being a corner of Matthew Hopkins, Land thence North 5 Degrees East by S^d Hopkins's Land 66 Perches to another of S^d Hopkins. thence North 85 Degrees West 32 Perches to a Chestnut tree thence South 5 Degrees West 8 Perches to a heap of Stones thence South Seventy three Degrees West 234 Perches to a Post thence North 17 Deg. West 92 Perches to a Chestnut Oak thence South 73 Deg. West 80 Perches to the Beginning containing 322 Acres with Allowance of Six P Gert &c. Survey^d the 7th of y^e Month call^d April 1741.
