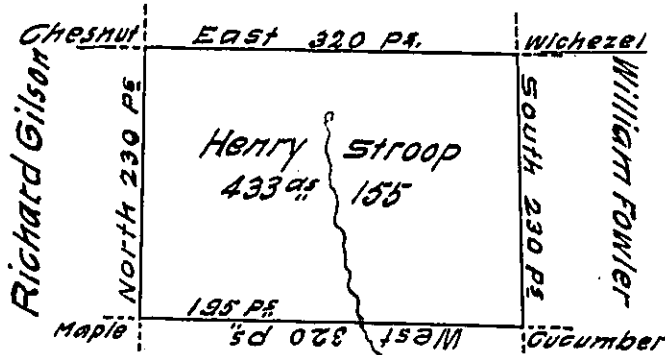


John Stricker

In persuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the fourteenth day of April A.D. 1792 granted to Henry Stroop adjoining land granted to John Stricker was surveyed on the 28th day of August A.D. 1827 the above described tract of land containing four hundred thirty three acres one hundred fifty five perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c.

situate in oil creek township Crawford County and Peter Gilson & Benjamin Gilson was residing thereon and there was built two houses fit for habitation of man and there appeared to be upwards of fifty acres of land cleared fenced & in a good state of cultivation.
