



A draught of a tract of land called Lairn situate on the west side of the North East branch of Susquehanna River adjoining and below a tract of land surveyed for David Lindsey at a place called the Standing Stone in the County of Northumberland containing three hundred and five acres besides the usual allowance of 6  $\frac{7}{8}$  cent for roads &c. Surveyed the 8<sup>th</sup> day of November 1774 for Robert Stevens in pursuance of a warrant dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of December 1773
