



In pursuance of an order No 1763 and dated the 3^d of April 1769 surveyed the abovescribed tract of land for Joseph Irwin containing two hundred and seventy three acres and 65 perches with an allowance proportioned to 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ cent. situate about four miles from Fort Pitt adjoining the lands of James Royal, Casper Foobs and Edward Smith & surveyed October the 25th 1769.
