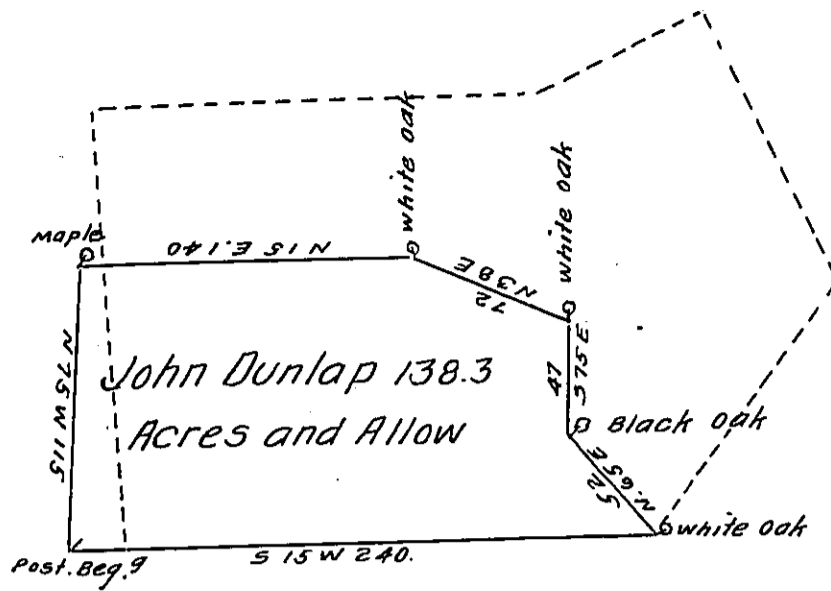


Charles Cochran's Land
