



In Pursuance of an Order N^o 1441 dated April the 3^d 1769 ~~by Charles Lukens~~
~~was~~ was Survey'd the 19th day of July 1769 by Charles Lukens (the then Deputy
 Surveyor of that District) on Bald Eagle Creek then in the County of
 Cumberland but now in the County of Northumberland, for Philip Gover all
 that Part of the Above Discr^{ib}d Tract of Land which Lies between
 the Creek and the Doted lines Containing fifty three Acres with the
 Usual Allowance, &c. but as that Survey did not contain much more then
 one Sixth part of the Quantity which his Order Call'd for, and he having
 Apply'd to me (by his Assignee) to make Such Addition thereto as he was
 Justly intitled to, I have therefore on the 24th day of July 1783 Added
 the Quantity of Two Hundred and fifty Seven Acres & 56 Perches
 as is Represented in the black lines in the Draught, ther-by making
 in the Whole Quantity of three Hundred and ten Acres and 56 P^{rs}.
 with the Usual Allowance of Six Acres & C^t for Roads &c.
