



In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of March 1748 — directed to William Parsons then Surveyor General — I have Surveyed to the Heirs of George House Dec<sup>d</sup> a Tract <sup>of Land</sup> on the West Side of the River Schuylkill in the Township of Blockley and within the Liberties of the City of Philadelphia — Beginning at a Marked Hickory a Corner of a Tract of Land belonging to the Heirs of Samuel Hasell dec<sup>d</sup> thence by Land of James Jones & Vacant Land S. 2° E. 24 perches to a Corner Stone — Thence by Vacant Land N. 88 1/2 E. 64 perches and 4 tenths of a perch ~~thence~~ to a post in a Line of Land now or late of Abraham Kite N. 9 E. 24 perches and 4 tenths of a perch to a post a Corner of the said Land belonging to the Heirs of Samuel Hasell aforesaid — thence by the same S. 88 1/2 W. 69 perches to ye Beginning Containing Ten Acres of Land
