



Surveyed on the 11th of Feb ¹⁷⁸⁹ 1783 to Jacob Fisher a Certain Tract of Land Situated in New Cowisohoppin the County of Philad^a Beginning at a large White Oak being a Corner of Michael Zeiglar's Land thence by the same North fifty Degrees west one hundred & Seventy Eight perches to a White Oak thence by y^e 5^d Nichols Land North forty Degrees East twenty six perches to a post thence by Vacant land North fifty Degrees West Seventy Eight perches to a post Thence by Vacant South forty Degrees West two hundred & Seventeen perches to a post thence South fifty Degrees East by land of Burget Hopman of George Welgas two hundred & fifty six perches to a post in the line of y^e German Tract thence by the same North forty Degrees East one hundred & ninety one perches to the place of Beginning Containing three hundred Acres with usual Allowance
