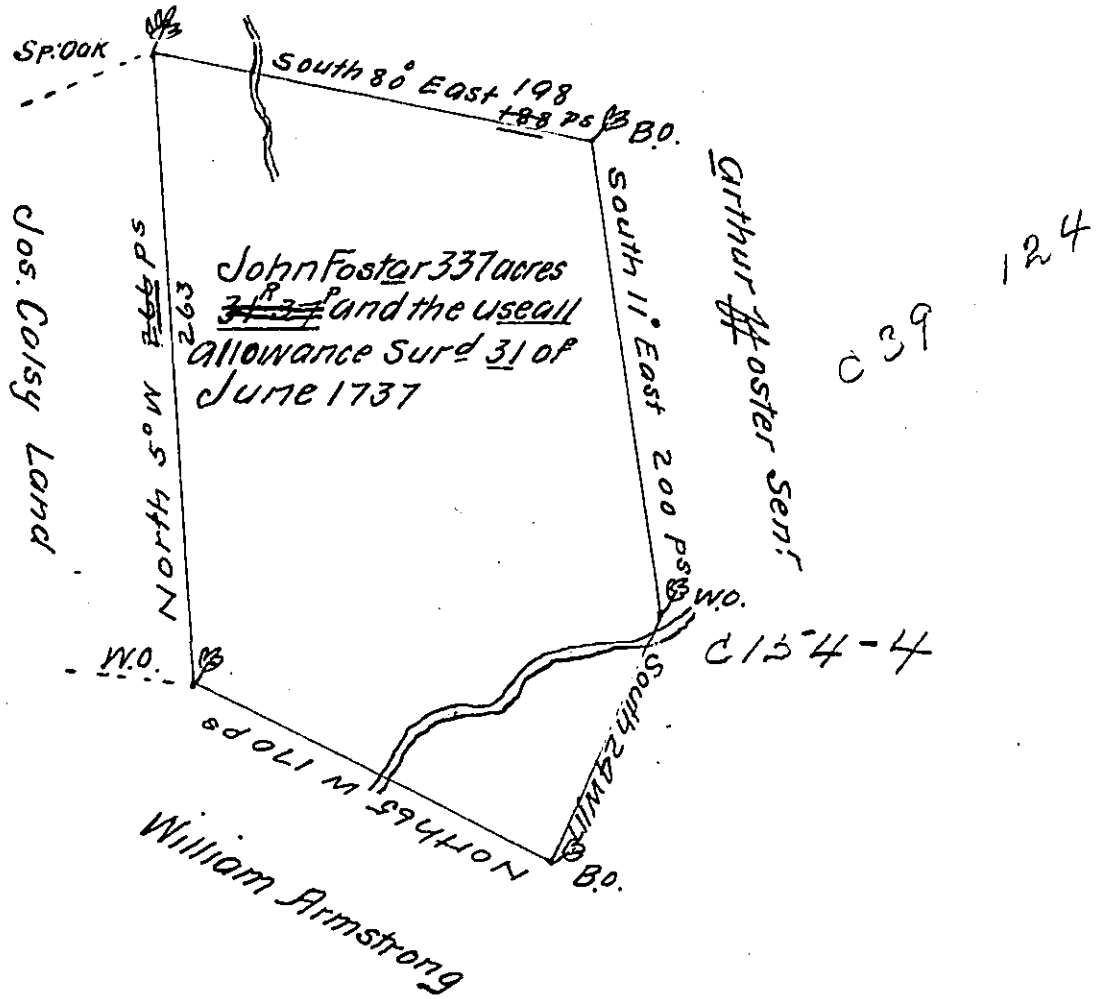

By Vertue of a warrant from the Proprietories dated the 20th day of January Anno Dom 1737 surveyed to John Foster a Tract of Land situate in the Township of Paxton in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Spanish Oak thence South 80 Degrees East 188 ps to White Oak thence South 11 Degrees East 200 ps to White Oak thence South 24 Degrees West 117 ps to a Black Oak thence North 65 Degrees West 170 ps to Whight Oak thence North 5 Degrees West 266 ps to the place of begining Containing 337 acres ~~39 quarters & 37 ps~~ and the allowance of six acres p Cent for Road and Highway.
