



By Virtue of a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing Date the ~~fourth~~ <sup>first</sup> Day of March Anno<sup>m</sup> Dom<sup>m</sup> 1737. I have Survey'd and Laid Out - William Wilson in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster. on the West side Susquehanna River. Three hundred & Seventy Acres of Land With allowance of Six Cent.

Beginning at a Red Oak a Corner of David Houstowns Land. Thence South Sixty Degrees Westerly One hundred and forty Eight perches to a White Oak. Thence North Thirty Degrees Westerly one hundred & forty perches to a Black Oak. Thence North Thirty Degrees Easterly Two hundred & Sixty two perches To a Black Oak. Thence North Sixty Degrees Easterly One hundred and fifty four perches To an Elm Tree by Conecocheye Creek. Then ~~thence~~ Down the Same Traversing the several Courses thereof near about four hundred and fifty perches Near to the place of Beginning
