



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the sixteenth day of August 1734. Surveyed unto John Johnson a tract of Land Situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a Dead White Oak a Corner of his other land. thence by the Same North East Seventy perches to a post. thence by the 5^d Johnson's Land North West forty one perches to a post. thence by Land of Frederick Reimer North East forty five perches and by Vacant Land the Same Course Eight perches to a Small White Oak. thence by Vacant Land South East one hundred and Sixty one perches to a post. thence by Vacant land South West one hundred and twenty three perches to a Large Black Oak. thence by land of Humphrey Murry and John Budd North East Sixty Six perches and by other land of the Said Johnson the same course fifty four perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing one hundred Acres with ye usual Allowance
