



The Draught of a Tract of Land called — situate on Jacks Creek in Cumberland County containing one hundred and seventy four Acres and seventy six perches with the usual allowance of six Acres $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads. Surveyed the 2nd day of Septem^r. Anno Domini 1768. in pursuance of an Order of Survey to Arthur Buchannon bearing date at Philadelphia the 4th Day of September Anno Domini 1766 and Numbered 1124.

N.B. One Charles Magill lives on the above Land at this time, and claims the Land, I will not take on me to say anything about the Dispute Between him and Arthur Buchannon, But have informed Buchannon and sent Notice to Magill, That I would send down a Draught of the Land Subject to their Different Claims and give my Opinion That there should be an hearing at the Board of Property before a preference be given to either of them.
