



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fifteenth day of February Anno Dom. 1738. Survey'd on the eleventh day of April 1739, to Andrew Mayze a tract of three hundred acres of land with the further addition of one hundred & fifty nine acres containing in the whole four hundred & fifty nine acres & the allowance of six acres ~~per~~ cent for roads. &c. Situate in the township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Hicory a corner of Robert McFerlands land thence by the land of Patrick Galaspy South 50 East 352 perches to a Hicory thence by vacant land North 34 1/2 East 213 perches to a post, thence by vacant land North 50 West 300 perches to a white oak thence West 123 perches to a black oak a corner of Hugh White's land thence by the land of the 5<sup>d</sup> Hugh White & Rob<sup>t</sup> McFerland south 15 West 147 perches to the place of beginning containing as above.
