



A draught of a tract of land situate in Upper Milford township in the County of Northampton and Province of Pennsylvania being part of a tract of 29<sup>acs</sup> 56<sup>per et</sup> allowance formerly taken up by Jacob Kirtenheir by warrant dated the 23<sup>d</sup> October Anno — 1745 which was afterward sold to Lewis Klotz and at last to Christian Steininger to whom the same was confirmed by a new Deed Poll dated on the 12<sup>th</sup> January Anno — 1776 by the said Lewis Klotz, but after the said Steininger's death a part of the said tract was surveyed for the use of the said deceaseds widow and the above part thereof intended to be sold.

Beginning at a stone in a line of land belonging to the Heirs of Michael Wolfgang deceased, thence by the same South 80 degrees East 59 perches to a stone thence by land of late Michael Rishel and by a tract of Henry Romich's land South 40 degrees West 94 perches to a stone a corner of Jacob Hahn's land thence by the same North 50 degrees West 21 perches to a stone set for a corner of the tract for the said widows use thence by the same North 15 degrees East 7 1/2 perches to the place of Beginning, containing eighteen acres and 33 perches of land together with the usual allowance of six per cent for roads or nine-teen acres and 48 perches of land strict measure.
