



A draught of a tract of land situate in Upper Millford township in the County of Northampton in the state of Pennsylvania containing one hundred and nine acres and 140 perches of land together with the usual allowance at six per cent for roads, that was surveyed on the 2<sup>d</sup> September Anno—1754 for George Urich, but afterwards resurvey'd for Casper Hepler by virtue of a warrant granted by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries to John Mock dated on the 31<sup>st</sup> January Anno—1752 who by his agreement or Deed Poll dated on the \_\_\_\_\_ conveyed all his right to the same to the said Casper Hepler since deceased who by his will devised the same to his four sons, then the oldest son sold his two shares thereon to his Brother Christopher Hepler and the youngest son sold his share to his Brother Casper Hepler who have now got the land divided accordingly, and the said Casper Hepler desires that the patent for the said whole tract shall be made to his said Brother Christopher Hepler. Now resurveyed for the said Christopher Hepler on the 18<sup>th</sup> June Anno—1783
