



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the twenty second day of May 1733. There was surveyed unto George Mifflin, Alexander Woodroop and Thomas Potts a tract of land situate near Gollbrookdale in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> beginning at a small hickery sapling in the line of John Rutter's land thence North sixty seven degrees East eighty seven perches and by land of Derick Clever one hundred and fourteen perches to a white oak a corner of said Derick Clever's land thence by vacant land North twenty three degrees West one hundred and fifteen perches to a stone thence by vacant land South sixty seven degrees West two hundred and one perches to black oak thence by vacant land South twenty three degrees East one hundred and fifteen perches to the place of beginning containing one hundred & thirty six acres with the usual allowance of six  $\frac{7}{8}$  cent. Surveyed October 19<sup>th</sup> 1733.
